Why do I need to make a Declaration of Interests?

- Declaring your conflicts of interest is a statutory requirement as detailed within the DfE's Academies Financial Handbook.
- It is also a requirement for academies to publish a Register of Interests on the academy's website for Members and Trustees (the governors of the academy act in the capacity of Directors of the Company and Trustees of the Charity), as well as Local Governing Bodies.

What is the rationale for declaring conflicts of interest?

- Members and governors have a legal duty to act only in the best interests of their academy and avoid any conflict between personal/pecuniary interests and those of the academy.

- The requirement for individual declarations of interest (used to create the Register of Interests) also goes some way to show that in spending public money, Members or Governors do not benefit personally from decisions in which they participate.


