### What is Health & Social Care?

### What will I be studying?

## Year 12: Human Lifespan Development

How does the human body change over time? What factors influence our development in positive and negative ways? This unit is externally assessed through a written exam which will be sat in January of year 12.

### Year 12: Sociological Perspectives

How does society influence our behaviour? What views do sociologists have on the causes of health and well-being, and how can sociological approaches be used to improve the delivery of health and social care services? This unit is assessed internally as a series of coursework tasks.

### Year 13: Working in Health and Social Care

What are the different jobs available in the health and social care sectors, and what skills and abilities does a person need to be successful in those jobs? This unit is externally assessed through a written exam which will be sat in January of year 13.

Year 13: Meeting Individual Care and Support Needs

What does excellent service look like in the health and social care profession? What might the different needs be of the clients you work and how can you respond to those needs as professionally as possible? This unit is assessed internally as a series of coursework tasks.
